Jim Wrobel is a podiatrist with The Villages Health with over 30 years of experience in the field, with his work funded by grants from the National Institute for Health, the VA and the American Diabetes Association. In a video presentation on diabetic

foot health, Wrobel discussed insights he gained in the field, including the importance of well-fitted shoes. Feet health depends on shoe choice, which means there's no such thing as breaking in shoes — only altering foot shape. Furthermore, he said it's important to keep on top of shoe size, because it changes more often than one might think.



Marion Senior Services recently released an action plan that pledges Marion County to become more age-friendly. The plan increases supportive care for seniors by promoting Ocala's Parks and Recreation facilities, creating new employment opportunities and health services.



Car temperatures can reach 135 degrees in less than 10 minutes, which can cause death to children, vulnerable adults and pets, according to the Florida Division of Emergency Management. Authorities say Floridians can dial 911 and use necessary force to remove a person or pet from a hot vehicle.

UF W. Martin Smith Interdisciplinary Patient Safety Awards Program recently granted the University of Florida's College of Medicine \$24,000 to begin a project in which patients are screened for hemoglobin levels before surgery. The project's aim is to improve outcomes and limit unnecessary blood transfusions. It's better to use a patient's own blood supply in surgery because of the potential side effects that can result from a blood transfusion, said Dr. Thorsten Haas, the director of patient blood management at the

At The Villages Health Learning Center

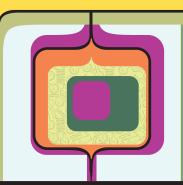
The Villages Health Learning Center is offering a new orientation for the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention-approved diabetes lifestyle change program on Sept. 14 at Mulberry Grove Care Center. Meetings are led by a specially trained lifestyle coach to help members learn new skills, meet their goals and keep them motivated. Classes meet once a week for 16 weeks, followed by every other week for two and a half months, and continue with monthly meetings for the remaining five months.
