From The Villages Health Doctors

The Villages Health is accepting new Medicare eligible patients at all of its primary care centers. This comes after The Villages Health staff received feedback from residents about wanting more opportunities to receive care. Patients must be Medicare eligible with a select Florida Medicare Advantage plan, and licensed insurance agents at the Health Insurance Resource Centers are available to help patients with their choices. From Local Health Researchers

Researchers at the University of Florida are using artificial intelligence to better understand a certain type of brain tumor and accelerate how it is evaluated. Researchers analyzed certain chemical characteristics of meningioma tumors and then used AI machine learning, according to a UF Health article. The findings help to identify tumor features, which doctors use to figure out what grade a meningioma tumor is, according to the article. Learning more about the meningioma tumor will help to understand which treatments a patient should receive.

At The Villages Health Learning Center

The Villages Health Learning Center offers a variety of events and resources to help residents stay on top of their health, including memory screenings. The memory screenings detect changes in someone's memory and cognition to see if they are related to aging or the start of a more serious memory problem. The 30-minute screening will not diagnose a patient but will help them see how each part of the brain is working. 
