#### From Local Health Staff

Caregiver stress syndrome, characterized by physical, mental and emotional exhaustion, is a condition Melissa Denham sees often as a dementia care specialist at The Villages Health. Caregivers who neglect their own health and solely focus on their loved one's needs are particularly

at risk. "Being a caregiver requires so much of a person, and generally, as their loved one's disease progresses, it takes more and more," Denham said. Solutions include using local resources, like respite care or The Villages Health Dementia Care Coordination Program.

### From Local Health Researchers

Charter Research in The Villages is currently conducting trials for Eli Lilly's LY3841136, a weight-management injection medicine. Led by medical director and principal investigator Jeffrey Norton, this Phase 2, double-blind study will test the safety and efficacy of LY3841136 for obese or overweight patients by comparing results between those who receive the medication and those who receive placebo doses. #### At The Villages Health Learning Center

"Hearing loss isn't just about hearing," said Dr. Al Turri, audiology director at The Villages Health. "Tons of studies show hearing loss has an impact on cognitive decline. It's the number one modifiable risk factor for dementia." Hearing aids were found to reduce the rate of cognitive decline by almost 50% over three years, according to a 2023 Lancet study. To help patients make the best decision before buying their next pair of hearing aids, Turri is hosting a free Hearing Aids 101 seminar from 9:30-11 a.m. Thursday at Lake Deaton Care Center. 
